APPLICATION FOR  
ANNEXATION BY THE COUNCIL OF THE  
CITY OF CLEVELAND

The Council of the City of Cleveland hereby petitions your honorable body for the annexation to said city of the territory hereinafter described, and respectfully represents that two-thirds of the legal voters inhabiting the territory proposed to be so annexed have heretofore, to-wit, on the 18th day of September, 1911, the said Council, by a vote of a majority of the members elected thereto, passed an ordinance authorizing such annexation, which ordinance reads as follows:

"Ordinance No. 22439. An ordinance authorizing the annexation to the City of Cleveland of a certain portion of Shaker Township. Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Cleveland, state of Ohio, that

SECTION 1. The following portion of Shaker Township adjoining the said City of Cleveland be and the same is hereby authorized to be annexed to said city, to-wit:

Situated in the Township of Newburg, now the township of Shaker county of Cuyahoga, state of Ohio, being part of original lots Nos. 418, 419, 420, 412 and 411 of said Newburg township, and further described as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of the center line of Fairmount Road with the westerly line of said original lot No. 412; thence from said point of beginning easterly along said center line of Fairmount Road to a point which is distant easterly 265.0 feet, measured at right angles, from the center line of Rice Avenue, now known as East Boulevard; thence southerly parallel and distant 265.0 feet easterly from said center line of East Boulevard to the northerly limits of the City of Newburg ~~to the easterly limits of the City of Cleveland~~ thence westerly but along said northerly limits of the City of Newburg to the easterly limits of the City of Cleveland; thence northerly and easterly, but along the limits of the City of Cleveland, to the place of beginning.

Section 2. That the City Solicitor be and he is hereby authorized to apply to the commissioners of Cuyahoga County, Ohio, to take such steps as may be necessary to cause the annexation of said territory to the city of Cleveland.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and legal publication".

that an accurate map of the territory proposed to be annexed is hereto attached.

W h e r e f o r e, your petitioners pray that your honorable

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body fix a time and place for a hearing of this petition, and that until said hearing, the petitions herein, and the maps accompanying the same be filed with the County Auditor where it shall be subject to the inspection of any person interested, and that upon said hearing the territory herein described be annexed to the city of Cleveland.

WHEREAS, on the 18th day of October, 1911, the City of Cleveland petitioned this Board for the annexation of certain territory in said petition described; and

WHEREAS, by resolution adopted on the 18th day of October, 1911, this Board resolved that the said petition should be for hearing at this office on the 20th day of December, 1911, at 10 o'clock A.M.; and

WHEREAS, on the 20th day of December, 1911, the hearing of said petition was postponed until the 2nd day of March, 1912; and

WHEREAS, on said last named date and time this Board again took up said petition for hearing;

NOW, THEREFORE, on motion of Commissioner Eirick, seconded by Commissioner Fischer, this Board finds that said petition was duly presented to this Board; that it was filed in the office of the County Auditor; that it was subject to the inspection of any person interested therein; that the time for hearing on said petition was fixed by this Board for the 20th day of December, 1911, and on that date continued until the 2nd day of March, 1912; that the time fixed for said hearing was not less than sixty days after the filing of said petition; that said time was communicated to the agent for the petitioners; that said agent caused due and legal notice containing the substance of said petition, and the time and place where the same was to be heard, to be published in the Cleveland Plain Dealer, a newspaper printed and of general circulation in the County of Cuyahoga, for a period of six consecutive weeks, and caused a copy of said notice to be posted in a conspicuous place within the limits of the territory proposed to be annexed not less than six weeks prior to the time fixed for such hearing; that said petition contains the ~~max~~ matters required, and that its statements are true; that the limits of the proposed annexed territory are accurately described, and are not unreasonably large or small; that the map is accurate; and that upon full hearing it is deemed right and proper that the prayer of

the petition be granted.

And it is further ordered that said territory be and the same is hereby annexed to said City of Cleveland, Ohio, as prayed for in said petition, and that the Clerk of this Board enter this resolution on the journal of this Board, and cause a certified transcript of all orders and proceedings in relation to such annexation, together with the petition, map and all other papers on file relating to the matter to be delivered to the Clerk of the City of Cleveland and forward and certify a copy hereof to the Auditor of this county.

The following Ordinance was passed by the Council of the City of  
Cleveland. Sept 3<sup>d</sup> 1913 and approved by  
the Mayor. Sept 8<sup>th</sup> 1913

Ordinance No. 29905.

AN ORDINANCE to authorize the annexation of territory to the City of Cleveland.

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Cleveland, State of Ohio:

Section 1. That the annexation of the following described territory to said City of Cleveland be and the same is hereby authorized to be made:

Situated in the Village of Shaker Heights, being parts of Original Lots Numbers 420, 421, 412 and 413 of Newburg Township, and is further described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the center line of North Woodland Road, which point is in a line parallel with and distant 265.0 feet easterly from the center line of Rice Avenue, now known as East Boulevard.

Thence from said place of beginning northerly, parallel with and distant 265.0 feet easterly from said center line of East Boulevard to the center line of Fairmount Road.

Thence westerly along said center line of Fairmount Road to the intersection of said center line with the southerly line of Original Lot No. 412.

Thence westerly along said northerly line to the southwest corner of Original Lot No. 412.

Thence north 0 degrees, 23 minutes 40 seconds west along the westerly line of said Original Lot No. 412, 530.18 feet to a stake which bears south 0 degrees, 23 minutes 40 seconds east along said westerly line, 23.96 feet from the intersection of said westerly line with the northerly line of Ambler Parkway, said stake also marking the southwest corner of Cleveland Heights Village.

Thence south 78 degrees 12 minutes 50 seconds east, along the southerly line of said Cleveland Heights Village to the intersection of said southerly line with the extension northerly of the easterly line of a ten (10) acre parcel of land in Original Lot No. 421 owned by A. P. Ditz.

Thence southerly along Ditz's easterly line and said line extended northerly to the center of North Woodland Road.

Thence westerly along said center line of North Woodland Road to the place of beginning.

Sec. 2. That the Solicitor of said City be and he is hereby authorized and directed to prosecute the proceedings necessary, and make application on behalf of said City and the Council thereof, to effect said annexation of said above described territory.

Sec. 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and legal publication.
